The provision of (financial) incentives to increase the engagement of companies in VET is highly debated not only in the DC dVET member countries, but also in partner countries of development cooperation that want to introduce dual approaches. This new DC dVET publication sheds light on the debate and aims to support a well-informed and differentiated discussion. It oulines different design options for support measures, critically reflects on pros and cons and presents in detail the situation in Austria, Germany, Liechtenstein and Switzerland.

Kuczera (2018), Incentives for Apprenticeships, OECD Education Working Paper No. 152

Key message: financial incentives are common, but their impact is often small. In line with the new DC dVET Discussion Note, Kuczera argues first, that schemes set up by the social partners and targeting specific sectors tend to be more successful and that second, in-kind support is more promising and less costly.
